
The stairs for evacuating the crew after an emergency landing via the hatch on Deck 2 start on this deck. Around, behind, and beneath these stairs is a storage space (EL).

TMoST mentions that Water Storage is on Deck 7. Of course, water can be placed there too, but the shallow space around this deck lends itself well to this function.

TMoST mentions Junior Officers have quarters on Deck 4. The book also explains that each officer likely has to share quarters with one other officer.

In JOURNEY TO BABEL, over 100 diplomats were transported by the U.S.S. ENTERPRISE. In THIS SIDE OF PARADISE, over 150 colonists were transported off-planet by the ship.

Gene Roddenberry imagined a higher standard of living for everyone, even enlisted crew members. There are more than enough rooms and beds on the ship to accommodate diplomats, colonists, etc. It would only be in such situations that crew members might be asked to share rooms.
