her confession of guilt. Its
lyrics and music are by Fred
Ebb and John Kander, who
created "Cabaret," and the
book was devised by Ebb
and Bob Fosse, who will
direct and choreograph for
the first time since "Pippin"
and the year he won the
entertainment world's
triple crown, Tony, Oscar
and Emmy. Its stars will be
three super winners, Gwen
Verdon, Chita Rivera and
Jerry Orbach. Philadelphia
gets the tryout.
